When Does the Bread and Wine Become the Body and Blood of Jesus?

Last Friday Robert Taft, an 86 year old Jesuit priest, died in Boston. He was one of the great Catholic scholars of the 20th century. He had become fascinated with the Church's liturgies in eastern Europe and the Middle East, where worship is conducted in such languages as Greek, Russian, Coptic and Armenian, and became a world authority on these liturgies. Most of his work will remain known only to scholars, but some recent work relates directly to our worship. He helped the Catholic Church declare that you can have a valid celebration of the Eucharist, even if the Eucharistic Prayer does not include Jesus' words: "This is my Body; This is my Blood".

That is startling for those of us who believe we rely on these words to bring about the consecration.

Profound knowledge of eastern worship enabled Taft, and others, to provide the scholarly assurance for the Catholic Church to declare in 2001 that an ancient Eucharistic Prayer, which had been prayed by Christians in north east Iraq since the 3rd century, and which does not contain Jesus' words, still brings about the consecration of bread and wine into Christ's Body and Blood. The Church declared it is other features of this particular prayer that assures the consecration takes place.

This was especially important when Iraqi Catholics could not attend a Catholic Mass but could attend Eucharist at another Christian Church using this unusual Eucharistic Prayer. From 2001 they could be sure that when they received Communion in this Christian Church, they truly received Jesus.

This declaration helps us understand that the consecration does not depend on a few chosen words in the Eucharistic Prayer. It is the whole Eucharistic Prayer which brings about this wonderful mystery of our faith.
