Are You On Board?

In some recent Sunday homilies I have been inviting you to respond to some challenges. On 6/7 May, the 5th Sunday of Easter, I highlighted St Peter's words to the early Church - and to us - "You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people", suggesting how we might express this "common priesthood" by adopting, as was early Church practice, the common posture of standing for the Eucharistic Prayer, thus acting out the common priesthood of priest and people. I invited people to remain standing that day for the Eucharistic Prayer. Then, on 10/11 June, the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, I invited people to remain standing after returning to their seats after Communion until the last person had received. I explained this as an expression of unity as the Body of Christ, conscious of each other and the spiritual bond uniting all who receive Communion, before kneeling or sitting for our personal prayer. On both occasions there were people who took up the challenge, notably at the evening Masses. Even now, some choose to stand at those times, while those around them kneel or sit. Last Sunday, I presented my third challenge: to imagine the Church as like a bus full of people. and for people to ask themselves whether they see themselves as drivers or passengers. I proposed that in fact, in the Church, all are drivers, baptism being our "driver's license". Is this how you see yourselves? Or do you see priests, or possibly Parish Councils, as the drivers, and others as passengers? I offered the idea that the Church is like a bus on a long journey, and that we need to share the driving - all of us. In the Church no one can be simply a passenger. These are recent challenges to current thinking and practice. How have you found yourself responding? This week Cardinal Luis Tagle identified fear of change as a main cause of division within the Church. These small local examples may be useful if/ when you reflect on your handling of change in the Church. Bigger changes are likely coming our way.
